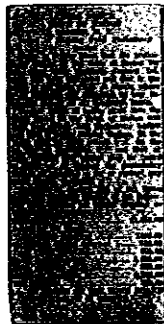

Section 2. Requirements:

(c) In every trailer camp there shall be a building in which shall be located the office of the operator or person in charge of said camp. A copy of the camp license, and of this ordinance, shall be posted therein and the camp register shall at all times be kept in said office.

(b) It is hereby made the duty of the attendant or person in charge, together with the licensee, to:

1. Keep at all times a register of all guests or house trailer occupants (which shall be open at all times for inspection by State and Federal officers and officers of the Team of Britain), showing for each such house trailer the following:

- a. Name and address of each occupant.
- b. Date of arrival.

2. Maintain the camp in a clean, orderly, and sanitary condition at all times.

3. See that the provisions of this ordinance are complied with and enforced, and report promptly any communicable diseases in the camp.

4. Maintain in convenient places, approved by one of the Chiefs of a Volunteer Fire Company located in the Town, hand fire extinguishers in the ratio of one to each ten units.

5. Prohibit the use of any trailer by a greater number of occupants than that which it is designed to accommodate.

Section 2. Inspection of premises.

Before the trailer camp commences operation, the Building Inspector shall make an inspection of the premises to determine that all requirements

of this ordinance have been complied with.

Section 10. Suspension and annulment

The Town Board may, after notice and proper hearing, revoke or suspend any license issued pursuant to the terms of this ordinance for a violation of any of the provisions hereof. Upon the revocation of such license, the premises shall forthwith cease to be used for the purposes of a trailer camp, and all house trailers shall be removed therefrom.

Section 11. Penalties

Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or to imprisonment for a period of not less than one day nor more than six months, or both such fine and imprisonment, and every day each violation exists shall constitute a separate offense and be punishable as such hereunder. The imposition of any penalty for a violation of this ordinance shall not excuse the violation or permit it to continue.

Section 12. Exceptions

SECTION XII - AMENDMENTS

All amendments to this ordinance shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Town Law applicable thereto. Any proposed amendment shall be submitted to the Town Planning Board, if such Board is in existence prior to the adoption of such amendment, for report and recommendation prior to final action thereon by the Town Board.
