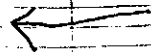

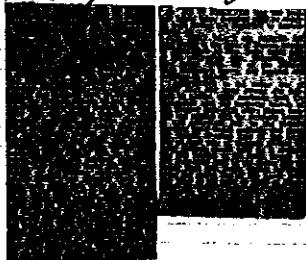

My dear Mr. Blakemore:

The Town Board of Boston, New York brings to your attention that there are now six existing mail routes which serve the Town of Boston, namely: Mail addressed to Boston, North Boston, Rossmore, Orchard Park, Golden and Eden. This is extremely inefficient and results in a great delay in mail delivery in this Town of Boston.

We bring to your attention the following resolution which has been submitted to the Town Board of Boston by the Boston Chamber of Commerce, Inc. and the Boston Home Owners Tenants Association, Inc.

"Be it resolved that the Town Board of Boston, N.Y. be memorialized to make proper application to the United States Post Office Department for the establishment, in the Town of Boston, of a First class mail distribution system whereby any letter mailed from any part of the world addressed to a resident of the Town of Boston will be received by such resident when addressed to him or her by proper name, street address if any and Town of Boston, New York 13021, U.S.A."

You will note that the resolution does not in any way change or suggest changes in the routes themselves.
