Present were Supervisor Fitzgerald, Justice Tills, Justice Stromecki, Councilman Quinn, Councilman Schunk, Town Attorney Maxwell and Highway Supt. Luno.

A motion was made by Justice Stromecki and seconded by Councilman Schunk that the minutes of the Annual Audit Meeting of December 29, 1970 be accepted as presented.

Five (5) Ayes

A motion was made by Justice Tills and seconded by Councilman Quinn that the Town Clerk's Monthly Report be accepted as presented.

Five (5) Ayes

A motion was made by Justice Stromecki and seconded by Councilman Schunk that the General Fund and Special District bills totaling \$3,910.32 presented at the January 6, 1971 meeting, be approved for payment.

A motion was made by Councilman Schunk and seconded by Justice Stromecki that the Highway bills totaling \$1,673.06 presented at the January 6, 1971 meeting be approved for payment.

A motion was made by Justice Tills and seconded by Supervisor Fitzgerald that the Supervisor write to the Assemblyman and State Senator in our District regarding the Southern Expressway and ask them to arrange a meeting with someone from the State Highway Department and our Town Board, and possibly other interested people in our community, to more fully inform the people in our community as to the progress being made, and that the Assemblyman and Senator be there also.

The New York State Planning and Development Clearinghouse sent an acknowledgment of receipt of our PNRS Letter of Intent for proposed Water District No. 2.

A report from Pratt, Edwards and Moncreiff regarding Sewer District #4, stated that for the first 145 feet of sewer now in place it was found to be properly placed and jointed and that they advised Mr. Robert Weller that the backfill could be placed.

Referred to the Planning Board were the following documents from the Erie and Niagara Counties Regional Planning Board:

Expansion and Amplification of Regional Economic Analysis
Technical Report on Housing

The Town Attorney reported that more signatures had been obtained on the petitions for the diminishment of Sewer Dist. #3 and extension of Sewer Dist. #4, and that the Assessors were checking to see that 51% of the residents had affixed their signatures to the petitions.

A motion was made by Justice Tills and seconded by Councilman Quinn that Jahn's Fashion Bar, 8978 Boston State Road, be granted a permit to repaint and reletter a 3' x 4' sign formerly used by the Boston Basket Barn, sign to be located in the same place as that of the Boston Basket Barn, and that it be specified on all sign permits that there be no flashing lights.

At 8:00 P.M. a Public Hearing was held on the proposed Snowmobile Ordinance which was published in the Springville Journal and the Photo News.

A motion was made by Justice Stromecki and seconded by Councilman Schunk that the Snowmobile Ordinance be adopted as amended in Section 4 (a) which should read "No person shall operate a snowmobile except on the shoulder of a Town highway, as herein designated, and at a speed not in excess of 25 miles per hour".

Assemblyman Walkley is to check with the Department of Transportation in Albany as to just when this second section is going to be bid and under what circumstances it is going to be bid. He is to send a communication to the Town Board on this matter and include what amount is set up in the budget for funding this project.

WHEREAS, the construction of Section 2 (Duerr Road to US 219), Section 3 (US 219 to Emerling Road), and Section 4 (Emerling Road to US 219 at Springville) of the Southern Expressway were all found to be consistent with regional planning by the Erie and Niagara Counties Regional Planning Board on July 7, 1968, October 10, 1970, and January 7, 1971, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the distance from downtown Buffalo to the Pennsylvania State Line via the Southern Expressway corridor is 81 miles as opposed to 90 miles for the Route 16 corridor.

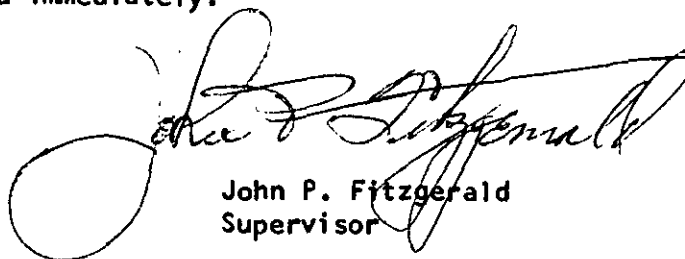
