**WHEREAS**, the Boston Town Board desires to exercise its authority under Article 6 subsection 2 of the Towns Procurement Policy adopted in January 2016 – Resolution 2016-1 to fore go the solicitations of any further quotation or proposals for the work to be performed because of the emergency circumstances.
