At the request of the Erie County Department of Public Works and the Town of North Collins, the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) has recently completed a traffic engineering investigation related to a request for a reduced speed limit on Belcher Road between New Oregon Road and Boston Road.

Based on the data collected and speed zone evaluation criteria, NYSDOT has determined that a speed limit of 40 MPH would be appropriate for Belcher Road. However, since a portion of Belcher Road represents a municipal boundary, approval is needed from both the Town of North Collins and the Town of Boston.

Therefore, if the Town of Boston is in agreement with the establishment of a 40 MPH speed limit on Belcher Road from New Oregon Road to Boston Road, please submit a Town Resolution and Form TE-9a *(enclosed)* to the Erie County Department of Public Works, who will then forward them to our Department. We will then complete the process to reduce the speed limit on Belcher Road to 40 MPH.



WHEREAS, on August 13, 2015 the Acting Commissioner of OPWDD granted permission to the CSDD to establish its group home on Cole and Omphalius Roads in the Town of Boston; and

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2015 the Town of Boston initiated an Article 78 proceeding under the NYS CPLR, challenging the decision of the Commissioner; and

WHEREAS, the Article 78 proceeding has been pending in NYS Supreme Court Index #2015-0157 until January 25, 2017, when Supreme Court Justice Diana Y. Devlin issued an Order Transferring Jurisdiction to the Appellate Division of the Fourth Judicial Department (in Rochester).

WHEREAS, the Appellate Division has issued an Order accepting the transfer from Supreme Court; ordering the Town of Boston to file its briefs by March 17, 2017 and scheduling the matter for its fall term commencing Tuesday, September 5, 2017.

Our firm represents Quaker Estates LP ("Project Sponsor") in connection with its pending request to amend the zoning classification of vacant land owned by the Project Sponsor on Boston State Road in close proximity to the 219 interchange to accommodate a proposed mixed use project ("Project").

Based on input that has been received subsequent to the previous submission of Part 1 of the Full Environmental Assessment Form ("Part 1 of the Full EAF") and detailed supporting reports and studies, the Part 1 of the EAF has been updated to state that the Project is a Type I action pursuant to SEQRA. A copy of the Amended Part 1 of the Full EAF is attached as Exhibit "1".

As indicated in my previous letter dated January 26th, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "2", the first step in the required coordinated environmental review of the Project pursuant to SEQRA is for the Town Board to solicit lead agency status by adopting a resolution of its intent to act as the lead agency and then providing involved agencies with thirty (30) days to determine if the involved agencies agree the Town Board should be the designated lead agency. The SEQRA Regulations expressly state that the environmental review of a proposed project should begin as early as possible in the review process for a proposed project requiring a discretionary approval or permit.

The Project Sponsor is requesting that the Town Board adopt a resolution during its upcoming meeting on March 1st for the purpose of soliciting lead agency status for the coordinated environmental review of the mixed use project.

The following is sample language that would suffice for purpose of the request for the Town Board to commence the required coordinated environmental review pursuant to SEQRA:

The Town Board hereby classifies the proposed mixed use project involving the rezoning of 28.51 acres of land on Boston State Road from C-1 Local Business District ("C-1") to C-2 General Commercial District ("C-2") and R-3 Two or More Family Residence District ("R-3") as a Type I action pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.4. The Town Board hereby declares its intent to be the designated lead agency for the coordinated environmental review of the mixed use project pursuant to SEQRA and requests that the Town's planning consultant issue a lead agency solicitation letter to involved and interested agencies.



Our firm represents Quaker Estates LP ("Project Sponsor") in connection with its pending request to amend the zoning classification of vacant land owned by the Project Sponsor on Boston State Road in close proximity to the 219 interchange to accommodate a proposed mixed use project.

The proposed mixed use project is an "action" requiring the Town of Boston to conduct an environmental review pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"). Based on the most recently updated Concept Plan, the proposed mixed use project is an Unlisted Action since it does not cross of any of the thresholds for a Type I action contained in 6 NYCRR Part 617.4.

While coordinated environmental reviews are not required for Unlisted Actions, it is the Project Sponsor's understanding that a coordinated environmental review will be conducted so that input can be received from involved and interested agencies with respect to potential adverse environmental impacts and the reports, studies and supporting documentation that have been submitted on behalf of the Project Sponsor. ¹

The first step in the required coordinated environmental review of the proposed mixed use project pursuant to SEQRA is for the Town Board to solicit lead agency status by adopting a resolution of its intent to act as the lead agency and then providing involved agencies with thirty (30) days to determine if the involved agencies agree the Town Board should be the designated lead agency.

The Planning Board discussed the proposed mixed use project during its most recent meeting on January 24th and chose not to make a formal recommendation to the Town Board relative to the commencement of a coordinated environmental review pursuant to SEQRA. Pursuant to SEQRA, the Planning Board is not required to make a recommendation in connection with the required ministerial step of the Town Board commencing the coordinated environmental review of the mixed use project pursuant to SEQRA. It is also important to mention that the SEQRA Regulations expressly state that the environmental review of a proposed project should begin as early as possible in the review process for a proposed project requiring a discretionary approval or permit.

The Project Sponsor is requesting that the Town Board adopt a resolution during its upcoming meeting on February 1st for the purpose of soliciting lead agency status for the coordinated environmental review of the mixed use project. The Project Sponsor is also requesting that mixed use project be referred to the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning ("ECDEP") for its review as required by NYS General Municipal Law Section 239-m.
