Councilman Keding reported:

- N.E.S.T. (North East South Towns) nothing to report
 - o Explained N.E.S.T. to Mrs. Siepierski
- Working with Sheriff's Department for medical drop-off
 - o Bins will be going in soon downstairs at the Town Hall
 - o All bins will be secured
 - o No keys will be kept at the Town Hall
 - o 'Sharp' bins will be provided
 - o Pet meds accepted
- Solid Waste contract comes due next year
 - o New liaison Chris for Waste Management
 - o Do we want recycling totes
 - Pick up would be every two weeks
 - Is an additional cost
 - Issue is hook pick-up or two-man pick because of snow piles and hilly terrain
- Electronic Recycling
 - Soon not sure of date (maybe August 26)
 - Would like to host this kind of event

Mr. Johnson: Is there anything coming up that the CAC can get involved with? Councilman Keding:

- Lower Pond
 - o Working with a vendor
 - No contract signed
 - o The Board made a motion to approve the bid
 - o It was too wet for them to do any work and now kind of late in the season
 - o Best now, I think, to wait until next year
 - o Patchin (Fire Company) has volunteered to drain the pond
 - o For a company to do that it could be upwards of \$7,400.00
 - o Scott Fellows (Parks Superintendent) found a submersible string trimmer for about \$700.00
 - That and a good pair or two of waders
 - If we could get the outer perimeter clear of weeds a lily pads, Don Buckley would have his Boy Scouts help clean away the debris for Community Service
 - If we could the Highway Department to help I think we could do it for a lot less money

- Upper Pond
 - o Has a leak
 - O Discussed getting drain tile and pull some of the water that comes off the Lion's Shelter, it has a metal roof, it wouldn't be dirty water
 - o A lot of seaweed and moss growing in there;
 - o The pond is not aerated
 - o As a long term project, using a windmill pump would help clearing up a lot of the grass

Councilman Keding: If the C.A.C. is not going to do L.E.A.F. this year, may I suggest that you look into a pump or windmill, you would have that L.E.A.F. money to spend for another project.

Mr. Johnson: Is there anything else for this evening? If not I will make a motion to adjourn.
