

FINANCIAL ADVISORY SERVICES AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Town Board believes that one option to increase traffic safety at that location would be to install four-way stop signage; and

WHEREAS, a traffic study is required prior to installation of a four-way stop; and

WHEREAS, both Feddick and Zimmerman are County roads, so such a study must be performed by the Erie County Department of Public Works;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Boston hereby requests that the Erie County Department of Public Works conduct a traffic study to determine if installation of four-way stop signage would be appropriate at the intersection of Feddick and Zimmerman Roads; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that if four-way stop signage is approved, that the Town of Boston requests that the County of Erie furnish and install appropriate signage; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall transmit this resolution and any other required documentation to the County Superintendent of Highways.

EASEMENT AGREEMENT FOR INGRESS AND EGRESS AT 5451 CREEKSIDE COURT

WHEREAS, Boston Orange LLC, the owner of SBL 211.09-1-19, known as 5451 Creekside Court, has requested that the Town of Boston grant an easement for ingress and egress to the property, as the actual existing driveway for that property is on the Town's property at SBL 211.09-1-16.1 and outside the area of an existing easement that the Town granted 1989; and

WHEREAS, granting the easement will not interfere with any Town purpose, will be consistent with the actual existence of the driveway, will help to preserve the value of the improvements at 5451 Creekside Court which benefit Town property taxes, and will facilitate the transfer of the property in the future; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the proposed easement is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the proposed easement the Town as grantor retains its rights to travel over the easement and the property owner as grantee shall be responsible for the costs and liabilities associated with maintaining the portion of the driveway existing on Town property; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, as lead agency, has given due consideration to the impact that the easement described herein may have on the environment and has determined that granting the easement, which involves no change in the type or scope of the existing driveway arrangement, is a Type II action and requires no further review pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), constituting Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, and 6 N.Y.C.R.R., Regulations Part 617.5; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution shall be subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to Town Law Section 64(2);

NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, subject to a permissive referendum, the Town Board of the Town of Boston hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute on behalf of the Town the attached Easement Agreement for ingress and egress at 5451 Creekside Court, and to execute any other or further documents as may be required to evidence or record that easement.

EASEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS EASEMENT AGREEMENT. made and entered into this _____ day of ______. 2021 by and between the Town of Boston. ("Grantor"), whose address is 8500 Boston State Road, Boston, New York, and BOSTON ORANGE, LLC, a New York limited liability company whos address is 6290 Creekbend Court, Clarence Center, New York 14032, and their successor and assigns, (collectively "Grantee"), (with Grantor and Grantee sometimes herein also referred to collectively as the "Parties").

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into that certain Easement dated April 19, 1989 and recorded in Liber 10017, Page 7 of Deeds on May 3. 1989 (the "Existing Easement"), by which Grantor granted unto the Grantee a perpetual exclusive easement to be used in common with the Grantor for allowing ingress and egress on property owned by the Grantor on Creekside Court, Boston, New York, known as Sublot 90, now being Tax Parcel No. 211.09-1-16.1, being approximately ± 3.4801 acres, (the "Grantor Property");

WHEREAS, Grantee is the current owner of an approximate ± .6196 acre portion of Sublot 91, known as 5451 Creekside Court, Boston, New York, Tax Parcel No. 211.09-1-19, which is adjacent to the Granter Property (the "Grantee Property"); and

WHEREAS, Grantee has requested an easement from Grantor for ingress, egress and regress to, from, under and over the Grantor Property for the benefit of the Grantee, its successors and assigns, together with its servants, employees, contractors, guests, licensees and agents, with all the necessary tools and equipment for all lawful purposes incidental to the maintenance, repair, replacement, access, and use of the gravel drive located on the Grantee Property, extending onto the Grantor Property, and connecting with the Existing Easement; and

WHEREAS, Grantor has agreed to grant unto Grantee an access easement over, on, upon, and across the Property, as described in <u>Schedule A</u> attached hereto and as approximately depicted on map attached hereto as <u>Schedule B</u> (the "Easement Area").

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of One Dollar and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, and subject to the terms and limitations hereinafter set out, Grantor does hereby grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto Grantee, its successors and/or assigns together with its servants, employees, contractors, guests, licensees and agents, a perpetual non-exclusive easement over, on, upon, and across the Easement Area in accordance with the terms contained herein (the "Easement").

TERMS, COVENANTS AND CONDITIONS

It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the Easement granted herein is and will continue to be subject to the following terms, covenants and conditions:

- 1. <u>Easement</u>. The parties acknowledge and agree that this Easement is a burden on the Grantor Property, running with the land and is benefit to Grantee and the Grantee Property running with the land.
- 2. <u>Purpose</u>. It is the purpose of this Easement to grant a permanent non-exclusive access easement over, on, upon, and across the Grantor Property across the Easement Area to and from the Grantee Property for all lawful purposes incident to the maintenance, repair, replacement, access, and

use thereof ("Permitted Purpose").

- 3. <u>Gates and Barriers</u>. Grantor shall not construct or place gates or other barriers limiting access to the Easement Area without the express written consent of Grantee. Keys and combinations for any locks on any such gates or barriers shall be exchanged between the Parties. No gate or other barriers shall interfere with Grantee's Permitted Purpose.
- 4. <u>Maintenance and Improvement</u>. Grantee shall be responsible for the costs or liabilities related to the operation, upkeep, or maintenance of the driveway on the Grantor Property, Grantee Property, and Easement Area.
- 5. Damages. In the event one of the Parties, in exercising the rights herein granted, damages the adjoining or surrounding property of the other Party, including without limitation the destruction of or injury to soil, gates, structures, fences or other improvements, the damaging Party shall immediately notify the other Party of any such injury or damage and shall promptly compensate the damaged Party for any such damage, including, but not limited to, the reasonable cost incurred by the damaged Party to repair such damage. Unless a longer period of time is approved in writing by the damaged Party, the damaging Party shall have thirty (30) days from and after receipt of written notice of such damage from the damaged Party or delivery of written notice to the damaged Party within which to cure the damage. Thereafter the uncured damages shall become an Event of Default hereunder.
- 6. <u>Exercise of Rights</u>. Grantee may allow Grantee's employees, agents, contractors, licensees, lessees and invited guests, hereinafter referred to as "**Permittees**", to exercise the rights granted herein.
- 7. <u>Liens</u>. Grantee shall keep the Grantor Property free from any liens arising out of the rights granted by this Easement or Grantee's activities related thereto and shall promptly discharge any such liens so asserted.
- 8. <u>Taxes</u>. Grantor shall pay all taxes and/or assessments on Grantor's Property. Grantee shall pay all taxes and/or assessments on Grantee's Property.
- 9. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Easement shall be interpreted, construed and enforced according to the laws of the State of New York.
- 10. <u>Default by Grantee</u>. Failure of a Party to abide by or observe any term, covenant or condition in this Easement shall constitute a default. Should a Party default hereunder, unless a longer period of time is approved in writing by the non-defaulting Party, the defaulting Party shall have thirty (30) days from and after receipt of written notice of such default from the non-defaulting Party within which to commence a cure of the default.
- 11. <u>Term.</u> This grant shall remain in full force and effect until terminated by the parties hereto in writing. Upon any termination hereof, Grantee shall, upon the request of Grantor, execute and furnish Grantor, at Grantor's sole expense, with a recordable written release evidencing a termination of Grantee's rights hereunder.
- 12. <u>Notices</u>. All notices and/or payments necessary to be given under the terms of this Easement shall be directed to above parties at addresses listed or updated addresses as from time to

time given. Except for any notices, demands, requests or other communications required under applicable law to be given in another manner, whenever the parties give or serve any notices, demands, requests or other communications with respect to this Easement, each such notice, demand, request or other communication shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally, mailed by certified or registered mail or sent by a nationally recognized courier service such as Federal Express and properly addressed in accordance with this section and shall be deemed given upon receipt of or refusal to accept same. Any party may change its address and/or contact person for such notices by delivering or mailing to the other party hereto, as aforesaid, a notice of such change.

- 13. <u>Title</u>. Grantor warrants that Grantor has requisite title to the Grantor Property and has the required authority to grant, execute and deliver this Easement to Grantee and that Grantee shall have peaceable enjoyment of the Easement Area. This grant is made subject to any and all liens, restrictions, grants, easements, rights of way and oil and gas leases and/or servitudes of whatever kind or nature which may be presently of record or visible by a physical inspection of the property. Grantee acknowledges that it has inspected the Property or caused the same to be inspected and accepts the Property in its present condition, as is, where is, with any and all defects.
- 14. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Easement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. For the purpose of easement, all references to Grantor and Grantee shall include their respective successors and assigns.
- 15. <u>No Partnership</u>. Nothing contained in this Easement shall be construed to make the parties hereto partners or joint venturers or render either of the parties liable for the debts or obligations of the other.
- 16. <u>Amendments</u>. This Easement may be amended or modified only by a written agreement executed, acknowledged and recorded by the parties to this Easement, or their respective successors and assigns.
- 17. <u>Compliance With Law</u>: The Parties agrees to comply with all existing and future federal, state, county and local laws, rules, regulations and governmental orders, as now written and as may be hereafter amended and enacted, which are applicable to the Easement Area, this Easement, the Grantor or Grantee Property respectively for who owns to title to each, the activities described herein, including without limitation, those pertaining to safety and the environment. Grantee agrees to comply with all existing and future federal, state, county and local laws, rules, regulations and governmental orders, as now written and as may be hereafter amended and enacted, which are applicable to the Generator Area and the activities described herein, including without limitation, those pertaining to safety and the environment.
