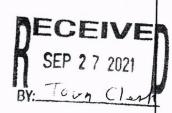

The undersigned proposes and agrees, if this proposal is accepted, to enter into an Agreement with Owner to perform all Work as specified or indicated in the project manual specifications for the Contract Prices and within the Contract Times indicated in this proposal price and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the project manual specifications.
- B. The Contractor is to base his proposal on the specifications. Any information obtained through verbal or telephone conversations is not binding and if the Contractor uses any for the bases of the bid he does so at his own risk.
- C. Cash discounts, offered by bidders for accelerated payment, will NOT be considered in the evaluation of proposals.

1.2 TIME OF COMPLETION

The Proposer agrees that after receipt of a Notice to Award and a consummation of an Agreement between the Owner and the Contractor in accordance with the terms of the Contract Documents, he will start work within fourteen (14) calendar days of the date of the Agreement and fully complete the Work in time indicated in the Contract Documents.

1.3 INDEMNIFICATION

1.4 INSURANCE

Dear Supervisor Keding:

As you are aware, we have been working with you relative to upgrades to your water system. As part of those discussions, we have considered water district consolidation and how that could affect costs associated with upgrades and/or expansion to the water system in the Town of Boston. The Town Clerk has supplied us with a lot of information relative to how the water districts were formed and how they are financed. This has been very helpful in helping us develop a proposal to complete a water district consolidation study and ultimately, a water district consolidation should the Town choose to move forward.

In August of 2020 we completed a report outlining the estimated cost to implement projects recommended by the Erie County Water Authority on your water system. That report included over \$10.4 million in improvements to the water system and pump station. In addition, The Town has also authorized bidding/work to rehabilitate 3 water storage tanks in your system, with ECWA taking the lead on design and bidding.

The purpose of the consolidation study would be to review and present various options for a water district consolidation and various means for how the users would be charged for the project. The proposed consolidation study will develop and present several options including:

- Consolidation of the existing districts only
- A Town wide consolidation, but no extension of water to any additional users
- A Town wide consolidation, with costs for extending public water to most of the Town

In order to move forward on this project, we will review the existing districts, the cost basis, existing debt, map and descriptions and formation documents for each district and district extensions. We will develop a spreadsheet that identifies all of the parcels for each of the options. For these options, we will then show the financial impacts to the parcels for each option to help the board make an informed decision on water district consolidation. We will present the financial impact to the water users based on several different costing options such as

equivalent dwelling units, assessed value and frontage. We include attendance at 3 board meetings and 2 public meetings with this proposal.

After consideration of the various options and approval from the Board, we will prepare a Map, Plan, & Report for the consolidation. The report will outline the proposed unit costs, proposed capital costs, district map and description, and unit definitions. Last, we will prepare the necessary SEQRA documents that will be required for the Town to proceed with the district consolidation.

Our proposed lump sum cost to complete the scope identified above is \$23,000.

We appreciate the opportunity to submit our proposal and look forward to working with all those involved. If you have any questions or require any additional information, we would be happy to meet with you at any time to discuss our approach and qualifications in detail.
