We speak with a united voice on matters of environmental planning and protection and encourage and support sound environmental policies and actions locally and across the state.



Why this is important

Municipalities large and small are taking steps to reduce food waste being sent to the landfill through education, food scraps drop off programs, backyard compost bin sales and more. Additionally there is a statewide and a federal focus on community organics management including policy and funding. New York State is also one of the most recent states to implement a law prohibiting organics to the landfill from large generators.

What to expect

This is your opportunity to ask questions, voice your opinion about important gap areas, and hear about assistance and funding available to take your program to the next level.
