This one-page flyer, compliments of your Town Historian, is part three of a cumulative series of articles on the subject of all things associated with the name Boston.

- Boston Town Band: This excellent organization was established in the Town of Boston, N.Y. in 1992.
- "We were just another band out of Boston": Lyrics from "Rock & Roll Band." A song by the rock group Boston from 1976.
- Boston: Eponymous debut album by Boston. Released in 1976.
- "Boston": A song by the rock group The Byrds, which was released as the B-side on a 45 in 2002.
- The Boston Tea Party: A music group that released an eponymous (debut?) album in 1968.
- The Boston Crabs: A music group that released at least two 45s: "Down in Mexico"/"Who?" on Capitol in 1965 and "Gin House"/"Leave My Woman Alone" on Tower in 1967.
- "Ye Olde Boston Tonic": In the Town of Boston, N.Y. during the sesquicentennial observation held in 1967. A free souvenir bottle from (the former) Warmus Pharmacy.
- Boston Valley Conservation Society: In the Town of Boston, N.Y. on Zimmerman Road. Originally organized as the Boston Rod and Gun Club in 1920. Renamed the Boston Valley Conservation Society in 1931. Incorporated in 1939.

- Boston Chamber of Commerce: In the Town of Boston, N.Y. Organized on April 5, 1963 (coincidently the town's birthday). Unfortunately, it no longer exists.
- North Boston Hardware: Apparently the name of two former businesses located in the hamlet of North Boston, Town of Boston, N.Y.
- Boston Hardware: A former business in the Town of Boston, N.Y.
- Boston Basket Barn: A former business in the Town of Boston, N.Y.
- Boston Realty Company: A former business in the Town of Boston, N.Y. Corner of Fairlane & 219.
- Boston Valley Quality
 Meats: Yet another former business in the Town of Boston, N.Y.
- Boston Bull: Another name for the Boston terrier breed of dog.
- Boston Valley News: Published in the Town of Boston, N.Y. from 1943 to 1945 by letter carrier Howard S. Owen. Sent to all 160 servicemen from the Town of Boston (and others) during WWII.
- Boston Bag: In the United States, (formerly) a two-handled bag for carrying books, papers, etc.
- Boston Bruins: A hockey team based in Boston, Massachusetts.

- Boston Celtics: A basketball team based in Boston, Massachusetts (there is an interesting story behind the team name's pronunciation).
- Boston Red Sox: A baseball team based in Boston, Massachusetts.
- Boston, Pennsylvania: Located southeast of the city of Pittsburgh in Alleghany County.
- Boston Run, Pennsylvania: Located north of Pottsville.
- Boston Road. Located in the Town of North Collins, N.Y.
- Boston Colden Road: Located in the townships of Boston and Colden in Western New York.
- Boston Cross Road: Located in the Town of Boston, N.Y.
- Boston Hollow Road: Located in Boston, Pennsylvania.
- Boston Ridge Road: Located in the Town of Orchard Park, N.Y.
- Boston State Road. Located in the townships of Boston, Concord and Hamburg in Western New York.
- North Boston Road. Located in the townships of Boston and Eden in Western New York.
- Boston Highway Department: Dutifully serving the citizens of the Town of Boston, N.Y.
