

Town Meeting 1813

At a meeting of the freeholders & inhabitants of the town of Boston agreeably to an act of the Legislature passed 1811 James Smith was chosen moderator after which the following votes were taken

1st That Samuel Abbott be supervisor for the ensuing year

2nd That Sylvester Clark be town clerk

3rd That Daniel Swain & Henry Kester be poor assessors

4th That John Twining fore S. Gent's & Freeman Carey be assessors

5th That Samuel Parmely Charles Johnson & Horatus Hatch be a committee to divide the town into ward districts

6th That Benjamin Kester Matthew Middleton & Jesse Carey be commissioners of highways

7th That Luther Hubbard be one of the assessors for fore S. Gent's refused to serve

8th That Samuel Parmely be constable & collector

9th That Joseph Mayo & William M. Pierce be constables

10th That Charles Johnson John Twining & Symon Drake be commissioners of common schools

Voted That James Smith Samuel Parmely and Sylvester Clark be inspectors of common schools

11th That Symon Drake Sylvester Clark Freeman Carey John Twining Luther South

The committee chosen to divide the
town into road districts report the
following list:

Dist 1st to begin at the town line near

George Williams & running from thence to the center of Lot No. 2^d including all the roads leading from thence.

2^d Beginning at the center line of Lot No. 2^d running from thence North to the center of the bridge between S. Hookwoods & V. Careys including the road running east to the town line & turning west to the center of the bridge across the Gaughquaga creek.

3^d Beginning at the bridge near S. Hookwoods & running from thence to the line between Wm. Peck & Thomas Swining including the roads west to the center of the bridges across the Gaughquaga creek.

4th Beginning at the south line of S. Swining's land & running from thence to the town line near Aaron Pierce & Gideon Smith including the road that passes Aaron Hampton's house to the foot of the hill.

5th Beginning at the main road near Jonathan Bump's running from thence eastward to the center of the transit line including the road leading southward to the highway also called

6th Beginning at the foot of the bridge on the road running from Saings Hill past Aaron Hampton's thence easterly to the state road from the north town line on the state road southward to the road near Jonathan Bump's.

7th Beginning at the south town line near Abel Knapp's thence northwardly as far as the north line of Aaron Benson's farm

8th Beginning at the north line of Dist 5th 7th



DEAR SIR:—

Throughout the past winter I have been daily in receipt of communications from citizens not only in your locality but throughout the entire State, showing a deep interest in the matter of the improvement of public highways by State aid and urging that the work may be progressed with all possible dispatch and that the roads now on the list awaiting construction be commenced early this spring. In view of the interest which has thus been exhibited and for your information as a member of your Board, I would state that an appropriation becoming available this spring of only one million dollars has been made by the Legislature just adjourned.

Under the law I am obliged to divide the appropriation for the work and mileage of roads upon which improvements are made under the Higbie-Armstrong act, equitably among the various counties throughout the State.

I am also obliged to award contracts for the various roads as they appear in their consecutive order on the list of roads awaiting construction, and after the plans for a road have once been approved by the Board of Supervisors and the road has taken its place on the list I am not authorized by law to either decrease or increase the mileage of such road.


Taking these facts into consideration I find that I will be able to advertise for proposals and award a contract for only one road in your county, the first road on the list being road No. 642 known as the ^{Angola} ~~Albany~~ ^{Albany} ~~Albany~~ ^{Albany} road.

In this connection I would state that in view of the many communications which I have received urging the progress of the highway improvement work, I requested an appropriation by the Legislature of seven million dollars in order that I might be able to advertise for proposals for a considerable amount of road work early in the season and award contracts for a large amount of road work which is now ready for letting.

This Department is so well organized that it would easily be able to take care of the amount of work which such an appropriation would provide and with the funds immediately available an early start could have been obtained and a good portion of the work completed during the present year.

Knowing you to be interested and in favor of the construction of good roads and as a representative of your county, I think you should know the situation as it now stands and that I will be unable to let any contracts this year except as above stated.


