At 8:30 P.M. a recess was called for a Public Hearing, after Public Notice, on the consideration of the cancellation of the franchise of Coy W. James for the Boston Valley Cable and T.V. Company. It was noticed that Mr. James had a tape recorder with him and it was announced by the Town Board that there is nothing official about this tape and that the minutes of the Town Clerk are the official record.

The franchise which was granted to Mr. James on October 7, 1959, was read by the Town Clerk. Also a letter from the Department of Public Works, signed by George J. Triepel, Highway Maintenance Engineer, and dated December 3, 1968, was read by the Town Clerk.

Highway Supt. Luno stated that the T.V. cables at Patchin Road and Fairlane Drive have been broken for very near a year and that the cable is not connected to the tower on Leibler Road. Mr. Luno also stated that he has had numerous complaints about the cable.

Mr. James stated that he has not had requests for tie-in to the cable. Justice Tills asked if anyone was getting service, and Mr. James replied "Yes, myself." Justice Tills asked "Any others?" On this question there was no response from Mr. James.

Mr. Manley Francis stated that he had applied for the cable service five years ago and still does not have it.

Mr. Norman Gage spoke with several comments. He said that when service has been in operation it has been historically very poor. That they were promised a fantastic number of channels, FM etc., and that the system never operated with more than three channels. Various people who were connected up to the cable system have not been for two years. Prior to that service was poor and intermittent and was off for periods of as long as two months. In 1966 roof antennas began to be prominent in the area. Cables are strung too close to the ground prohibiting full ingress and egress to properties. In August, 1968 a family moved out and the moving van got tangled up in the cable and broke it. The broken cable hung and laid on the shoulder of the road for from three to four months and was not cleared away until possibly November. This is very dangerous for children and pedestrians. Poles and cables are unsightly. Mr. Gagne asked that the Town Board revoke this franchise and actively seek another.

Mrs. Nancy Coots stated that for two and one-half years a cable has hung on her property and that she called Mr. James and asked him to remove the wires. The wires are still hanging.

Mrs. Manley Francis also requested that the franchise be revoked.

Not anyone appeared in favor of continuing the franchise.

Since the cable system has not been maintained in a safe manner and since the service is evidently not available to the public, the system not being in operation, and since the cable system does not seem to be serving anyone other than Coy W. James, and even service to him being in dispute, and since the absence of service has been for a period of approximately three years,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the franchise that was given to Coy W. James by contract dated October 7, 1959, be revoked and that Mr. James be directed to remove any poles from the Town right-of-way within the next two weeks.

THIS AGREEMENT made this 5th day of February, 1969,
between the Town of Boston, Erie County, New York, hereinafter
designated as "party of the first part" and the Boston Emergency
Squad, Inc., a New York membership corporation of Boston, New York,
hereinafter designated as "party of the second part",

W I T N E S S E T H :

WHEREAS, prior hereto private ambulance and first aid
service previously furnished to the residents of the Town of
Boston was discontinued, and thereafter the Boston Emergency Squad,
Inc., a membership corporation was formed and personnel trained
to furnish said ambulance service to the residents of the Town of
Boston; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Boston, through the said Town
Board, party of the first part, duly authorized a contract with
the party of the second part, for the furnishing of general
ambulance service and first aid to persons within the boundaries
of the Town of Boston upon the terms and provisions herein set
forth,

NOW, THEREFORE, the party of the first part does hereby
engage the party of the second part to furnish general ambulance
service and first aid to sick or injured persons found within the
boundaries of the Town of Boston, pursuant to the provisions of
Sections 122 and 122-b of the General Municipal Law of the State
of New York, in manner following, to wit:

1. The Boston Emergency Squad, Inc., party of the second
part, shall, at all times during the period of this agreement, be
subject to call for the providing and furnishing of general
ambulance service and first aid assistance for the purpose of
transporting sick or injured persons found within the boundaries
of the Town of Boston, Erie County, New York, to a hospital,
sanitarium or other place for the treatment of such illness or
injury as such person may require.

2. Said party of the second part shall respond and attend
upon such sick or injured person as soon as practicable, without
delay, with available trained personnel and equipment, and shall
proceed diligently in every way reasonably calculated to assist
and transport said sick or injured person found within the
boundaries of the municipality to a hospital, sanitarium or other
place for the treatment of such illness or injury.

3. The said party of the second part further agrees to
adequately supply sufficiently trained and experienced personnel
for the services required as set forth in Paragraph "1." herein.

4. This contract is entered into between the parties pursuant to the provisions of Sections 122 and 122-b of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, and all terms, provisions and conditions of said statute are herein incorporated by reference as though fully stated in this agreement.

5. In consideration for the furnishing of general ambulance service and first aid assistance, as herein specified, the party of the first part shall pay and the party of the second part shall receive the annual sum of \$3,500.00 per year, and the party of the first part covenants and agrees to pay the said annual sum to the party of the second part on or before April 1st in each contract year.

6. The Town of Boston, party of the first part, further agrees to furnish to the party of the second part, without charge, a proper and adequate ambulance motor vehicle or vehicles, adequately equipped, for the exclusive operation and use of the party of the second part in carrying out the terms and conditions of this agreement. The said party of the first part further agrees, without charge, to furnish an adequate structure or garage for the storage of said vehicle and equipment while same is in custody of the party of the second part.

7. The Town of Boston, party of the first part, further agrees to defray the expense of and to pay the cost of insurance indemnifying against liability for the operation of said ambulance and equipment incidental to the furnishing of such ambulance service, and any premium or premiums for compensation of the members and personnel of the party of the second part for medical expense, loss of wages, compensation benefits or other claims arising by reason of the injury to or death of a member of the said Boston Emergency Squad, Inc., sustained while answering, attending upon or returning from any such call, or while engaged in any other volunteer duty within the terms of this agreement and, in case the party of the second part shall be compelled or required to pay any such claim, the party of the first part shall reimburse the party of the second part the amount paid within thirty (30) days after the making of such payment.

8. The party of the second part agrees to furnish to the Town Board of the Town of Boston a written itemized statement of its disbursements and expenses no later than September 30th of each year during the term of this agreement. It is further agreed by the party of the second part that no monies paid hereunder to the party of the second part shall be used for the purchase of radio equipment except upon the prior approval of the Town Board of the Town of Boston.

9. This agreement shall continue for a period of one (1) year and from year to year thereafter unless either party shall determine to terminate this agreement by notifying the other party, in writing, before the 30th day of September, that it elects to terminate the contract on December 31st of that year; thereafter the contract may be amended or terminated and a new contract entered into in lieu thereof, pursuant to the procedural directives of the Town Law of the State of New York.


MAP OF THE TOWN OF BOSSION



Specifications for one hopper type, salt, sand, cinder and calcium spreader for ice and dust control on highways.

Spreader shall be hopper type of 6 cu. yd. water level capacity. Frink Model FS-6 or approved equal to mount on the frame of a truck.

Hopper shall be all welded construction of automotive steel with 3/16" thick abrasion resistant renewable steel bottom. Sides are to be supported by three formed gussets and top corners miter welded. There is to be a formed inside cross brace at the center. Discharge opening in one end 12" high with variable positive locking gate.

There shall be 3/16" thick catwalks on both sides of the hopper not less than 21" wide x 7'-8" in length and located so as to provide fenders over the rear wheels of the chassis with mud flaps attached to the front and rear ends of each catwalk. The upper surface of the catwalks shall have a tread plate surface.

The conveyor shall have an overall width of 20" with replaceable pintle type side chains of 20,000 P.S.I. and shall be driven by hydraulic motor direct connected to worm gear speed reducer of 50 to 1 ratio.

There shall be a 4 section screen over the top of the spreader and hinged on not less than a 1 3/4" diameter tube with not less than 1/4" wall and supported at each end and in the center. The screen shall be made of 1/2" diameter wire and have 3" square openings and framed on 2x2x5/16" angle frames.

Spreader shall be so designed that 2 - 14" diameter hydraulic driven spinners can be installed in place of the 1 - 18" diameter, so as to spread the material forward of the rear wheels.

There shall be 3/8" x 1 1/4" flights welded to chain links on 6 1/2" centers. There shall be a replaceable inverted "V" over the chain. The conveyor rails shall be formed from not less than 10 gauge steel and the conveyor driven sprockets shall be 11 tooth cast malleable iron on 17" centers. There shall be spring loaded screw take up adjustment for conveyor side chains. All bearings shall be sealed and self aligned. There shall be a discharge chute formed from 10 gauge steel to direct the flow of the material onto the spinner.

There shall be one/diameter spinner made of 3/16" plate with four replaceable vanes and the spinner assembly must swing from vertical to horizontal for storing or stocking material. The spinner shall be driven by direct connected hydraulic motor to the spinner shaft which is supported by two oilite bronze bushings in oil bath, sealed at top and bottom.

There shall be chain adjustable spinner baffles on 4 sides of the spinner and mounted so as to control the distance the material shall be spread.

There shall be a constant running type integrally mounted P.T.O. and gear pump, and not less than 20 gallon capacity hydraulic oil reservoir.

Such note shall be dated November 6, 1969 or such later date as the Supervisor by his execution thereof will determine, will mature on November 6, 1970 will bear interest at the rate not exceeding 6.25 per centum per annum payable at maturity, will be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America at the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company, Buffalo, New York, and will be signed in the name of the Town of Boston, by the Supervisor, attested to by the Town Clerk of the Town of Boston, and will be sealed with the seal of said Town of Boston.

3. The said bond anticipation note shall be of substantially the same terms, forms and contents as the form of the note hereto annexed to this resolution.


4. The faith and credit of said Town of Boston are hereby pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bond anticipation note. Such bond anticipation note shall be paid from the proceeds derived from the sale of said bonds or may be redeemed as provided by the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

The Supervisor of the Town of Boston is hereby authorized to sell such bond anticipation note at private sale for not less than par and accrued interest at a rate not exceeding the rate above specified, and the said Supervisor is authorized to deliver such bond anticipation note to the purchaser upon payment of the purchase price and accrued interest, as above specified. The receipt of the Supervisor of the Town of Boston shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.



WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Boston, pursuant to law, acts as Water Commissioner for Water Districts of the Town of Boston, and,

WHEREAS, it is now deemed prudent and advisable for this Board to adopt certain revised procedures, rules and regulations with respect to Water District #1 and any future water districts of the Town of Boston or any future extensions of existing water districts.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the following rules, regulations and provisions and procedures are hereby established for the installation and construction, inspection and acceptance of water line utilities within existing Water District #1 of the Town of Boston or any future extensions thereof or any future Water Districts hereafter created:

1. All applications as herein specified shall be made to the Town Board of the Town of Boston by the filing of said application with the Town Clerk of the Town of Boston.

2. The application shall be a request for review and approval and the following copies of preliminary plans and specifications shall be filed in the following offices:

a. Four (4) copies of preliminary plans and specifications shall be filed with the Town Engineer with the request for written review and recommendations.

b. One (1) copy shall be filed for forwarding to the Planning Board of the Town of Boston for review and recommendation.

c. Two (2) copies shall be forwarded and filed with the Erie County Water Authority for their review and recommendation.

d. One (1) copy of said plans and specifications shall be retained by the Town Engineer for review by the Town of Boston Highway Superintendent.

3. Upon approval of the proposed water main extension as shown on the plans and specifications, the Town Engineer shall notify the Town Board in writing of such approval and shall forward a copy to the applicant. The applicant thereupon shall provide six (6) additional sets of plans and specifications to accompany the Town Engineer's recommendation and approval.

4. Subsequent to the Town Engineer's recommendation for approval, said application shall thereupon be submitted to the Town Board and when approved by the Town Board, the following copies of the plans and specifications shall be distributed:

One (1) copy - Town Clerk
One (1) copy - Applicant
One (1) copy - Planning Board
Two (2) copies - Town Engineer
One (1) copy - Erie County Water Authority

5. In the event that the Town Engineer shall disapprove the plans and specifications for the water line extension, one (1) copy of said plans and specifications shall be returned to the applicant for required revisions and engineering comments noted thereon.

a. After engineering revisions and corrections have been made, on said plans and specifications by the applicant, said applicant may again resubmit same for review and recommendation to the Town Engineer. Such resubmittals shall clearly state that it is a second submittal and shall give the date of the first submittal for review.

b. In the case of second or subsequent submittals by the applicant, the procedure hereinbefore stated with reference to a first submittal shall be followed.

6. Before proceeding with construction the applicant shall file a construction schedule with the Town Engineer and shall make arrangements for inspection of construction.

7. Upon satisfactory completion of pipe installation the applicant shall arrange for testing and sterilization of the new water main. All testing shall be

performed in the presence of the Town Engineer or a designated member of his staff. After testing and approval of test, the line shall be sterilized and the applicant shall request the Erie County Department of Health to take samples and perform bacteriological tests. Results of such test shall be sent to the Town Engineer.

8. All construction materials for the installation of said water lines shall comply in full with all the plans and specifications as required by the original installation of Water District #1, which plans and specifications are now incorporated in the lease management contract and are on file with the Erie County Water Authority and the Town Clerk of the Town of Boston. All procedures for testing and sterilization of said water lines upon their completion shall be done in accordance with the Erie County Water Authority specifications.

9. Upon completion and approval of construction, satisfactory testing and sterilization, the applicant may request the water to the new main be turned on. This request shall be by letter to the Town Engineer.

10. After completion and approval of construction and before a formal request to the Town Board to accept the new main as Town property, the applicant shall file with the Town Engineer a reproducible "as built plan". The "as built" plan shall show the location of the water and appurtenances including location ties for valves.

11. Within 60 days after the completion, testing and sterilization of the new main and the submission of the "as built" plan, the applicant shall file a formal request with the Town Board for the acceptance of the main as Town Property.

The request by the applicant for acceptance of the construction shall be accompanied by an affidavit of completion certifying that the work has been done in accordance with the plans and specifications and a further and separate affidavit that all bills and obligations for the water line installation and construction have been fully paid and satisfied and that no mechanic's lien exists against said construction and that to the applicant's knowledge no possibility exists that any claim will be filed against him or the Town in connection with this water main installation. This request for acceptance shall be accompanied by a letter from the Town Engineer stating that the new water main is completed and "as built" plans have been received and that said installation can be accepted by the Town Board of the Town of Boston. The Town Attorney shall also forward a separate communication relative to said application for acceptance stating that all easements or rights of way for the new water main are available.

The applicant shall further submit at this time a written guarantee to the District executed by the owner of the subdivision or the lands to be

Recreation (Article 13, General Municipal Law)

Amounts for parks, playgrounds and recreation centers established under the provisions of Article 13 of the General Municipal Law.

Refuse and Garbage (Section 130-v, General Municipal Law)

The share of the cost to be paid by the town in accordance with an agreement between the town and one or more villages for joint refuse and garbage collection and disposal, unless otherwise provided.
